1. Executive Summary 2024

In 2024, A2WG moved from early establishment into a stronger growth phase. Success Story: Building the systems behind the impact

The major story of 2024 was institutional strengthening. A2WG used the year to move from early action into organisational readiness - improving how it mobilises resources, documents work and prepares for donor-facing implementation. This behind-the-scenes growth helped make later programmes possible, including stronger engagement in leadership, protection and governance spaces.
